RECYCLING UPDATE—EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY

There has been a major change in items that can be recycled. China has been the largest importer of the world's recycled commodity. In 2017, China announced dramatic changes for acceptance criteria of imported recyclables. An updated list of both acceptable and non-acceptable items is available in the Borough office as well as on the Borough website. Below are some examples of each.

Recyclable items:	Non-Recyclables:
Aluminum & Steel Cans	Plastic Bags
Plastic Bottles & Jugs: #'s 1, 2 & 5	Shredded Paper
Newspaper Only	Aerosol Cans
Cardboard	Pizza Boxes

All recyclable items must be clean, dry and flattened. No food contamination.

TRASH/RECYCLING DAY IS MONDAY. DO NOT PUT YOUR COLLECTION ITEMS OUT PRIOR TO SUNDAY AFTERNOON. ALL CONTAINERS MUST BE REMOVED FROM YOUR PICK-UP SITE BY MIDNIGHT.

1. The five (5) container limit per household must not exceed 60 lbs. If you use a two-wheeled trash toter, you are allowed two (2) additional containers/bags.
2. One (1) large item per week may put out in addition to your 5-bag limit.

All 2018 tax payments **MUST** be RECEIVED by 12/31/18!! Postmark is NOT accepted for last payment of the year. NO PERSONAL CHECKS will be accepted after December 10th. Payments after December 10th must be in the form of cash, money order or certified bank check!

Landlords: Per Hallam Borough ordinance, you are required to report, in writing, tenant information to my office within 14 days of move-in/out activity. Penalties do apply if not reported!

Hallam Borough Council meets for a regular scheduled meeting, the second Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m. in the Hallam Borough Municipal building located at 250 West Beaver St, Hallam Borough.

AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

THE BOROUGH WILL PROVIDE REASONABLE ACCOMMODATION FOR ALL PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES PROVIDED THEY CONTACT THE BOROUGH 5 DAYS PRIOR TO THE NEED.

Emergency Management Agencies throughout the South Central Task Force (SCTF), which includes the counties of Adams, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Lancaster, Lebanon, Perry and York, are implementing a new emergency notification service. This service will allow residents and businesses in the eight county area to be notified of an emergency situation and important alert messages in a variety of ways, including on their cell phones, home and work phones, by text messaging and e-mail.

Many residents and business already have been added to the system from publicly available White and Yellow pages information. But this listing only provides a single contact phone number. People with unlisted phone numbers, or those whose primary phone number is a cell phone or VoIP, must provide their contact information if they wish to receive these alerts. People who wish to receive alerts on phone numbers other than the number listed in the White or Yellow pages, and those people who would like to receive alerts via email, SMS, TDD/TTY, etc., will also need to register.

Emergency Alert System

- The Integrated Public Alert and Warning System (IPAWS), is a modernization and integration of the nation's existing and future alert and warning systems, technologies, and infrastructure.
- The Emergency Alert System (EAS) is a national public warning system that requires broadcasters, satellite digital audio service and direct broadcast satellite providers, cable television systems, and wireless cable systems to provide the President with a communications capability to address the American people within 10 minutes during a national emergency.
- EAS may also be used by state and local authorities, in cooperation with the broadcast community, to deliver important emergency information, such as weather information, imminent threats, AMBER alerts, and local incident information targeted to specific areas.
- The President has sole responsibility for determining when the national-level EAS will be activated. FEMA is responsible for national-level EAS tests and exercises.

PENNSYLVANIA YELLOW DOT PROGRAM

This program was created to assist citizen's in the "golden hour" of emergency care following a traffic accident when persons may not be able to communicate themselves. By placing a yellow dot in your vehicle's rear window, this will alert first responders to check your glove compartment for vital information to ensure that you receive the critical medical attention you need.

GRASS AND WEEDS BE GONE!

Chapter 10, Part 4, of the Hallam Borough Code of Ordinances, titled *Grass, Weeds and Other Vegetation* states that the property owner or occupant is responsible for removing, cutting or trimming all grass, weeds and other vegetation growing upon any part of the sidewalk area.

This area includes any grass, weeds and other vegetation growing in the sidewalk cracks and along the curbing at the street. The gutter lines should be free of such to allow stormwater to flow to the storm drains.

The Borough will be delivering door hanger notices for any persons who fail to comply.

NEED A BUILDING PERMIT???

A building permit is required for all NEW residential construction. A building permit is required for all residential additions when: (1) an additional structure is added, (2) when an existing structure is altered, or (3) when a change of use to an existing space is established, including partition wall changes. Cosmetic changes to a dwelling, such as cabinet refacing, siding replacement and painting do not require a building permit. An upgrade in doors and windows does require a permit when existing openings are to be enlarged requiring the addition of larger structural headers. The addition or replacement of structural members to a roof or addition of roofing materials over existing layers of roofing requires a building permit.

Identify the exact location (street name, closest address of a building, nearest cross street) and identify the pole number (a 10-digit number located on a metal tag on the pole, i.e. 22543-89456). If the number is missing from the pole, this must be reported along with the exact location. Report the problem (light out, goes on & off, etc.) by calling the Borough Secretary at (717) 755-0810.
