BOROUGH PROJECTS

Updates will be provided to residents as they become available

Cherry Avenue—As a result of required periodic inspections performed by the Borough Engineer over the last two years, Council was informed that the one-lane bridge on Cherry Avenue has deteriorated to the point that it must be replaced. Since grant funding was not awarded for this particular project, it will be paid for from the Hallam Borough Liquid Fuels Fund and Bridge Fund. In February 2022, the contract was awarded to Clearview Excavating in the amount of \$282,427.00. The contractor is estimating the project will take place in the July-August timeframe and take 2-3 weeks to complete. Updates for this project will be provided to residents as they become available.



Charles Circle and Steven Drive—A contract to chip seal Charles Circle and Steven Drive was awarded at the May 9, 2022 Council meeting. The contractor, Russell Standard, estimates the project will take place in July. Due to the application process of the material, no parking signs will be posted and must be adhered to during the project.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

Susquehanna Valley EMS (SVEMS) has provided ambulance service to Hallam Borough since 2017. SVEMS has merged with Penn State Health Life Lion LLC and are continuing to provide the same service to Hallam Borough. Penn State Health recently mailed the annual membership subscriptions in the form of a return mailer. If you did not receive one, do not have a current subscription, or have disposed of the recent mailing, there are paper copies available at the Borough office. TRASH AND RECYCLING

CURRENT HAULER = REPUBLIC SERVICES

Trash, Recycling and One Large Item are collected every **MONDAY** unless an observed holiday falls on a Monday. Collections will then be delayed one day and collected on Tuesday. Observed holidays include New Year's Day, Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. **For 2022, Memorial Day (May 30th), July 4th and Labor Day (September 6th) collections will be delayed one day.**

DO NOT PUT YOUR TRASH OUT PRIOR TO 4:00 PM SUNDAY! ALL CONTAINERS MUST BE REMOVED FROM PICK-UP SITE BY MIDNIGHT ON THE DAY OF COLLECTION!

- You are allowed to set out a maximum of six(6) 32-gallon bags/cans each week. The large two-wheeled tote counts as three (3). Be sure the containers do not exceed 60 lbs.
- Tree limbs are to be 48 inches or less and bundled.
- You may set out one large bulk item per week in addition to your 6-bag limit. If for some reason the large item is unable to be collected, the trash hauler will place an orange tag on the item.

CLAYTON ELY EMIG PARK

There are three (3) pavilions at Emig Park. Each of the pavilions are named; however, only two (2) of them are available, for a fee, to reserve. The third, and smallest pavilion, is available on a first-come, first-served basis.

The Maple pavilion is located adjacent to the basketball and volleyball courts and the upper parking lot. The Oak pavilion is located adjacent to the lower parking lot and is closest to the creek. The third pavilion, Elm, is situated between the Maple and Oak pavilions.

Reservations are not required to use the pavilions but are highly recommended over the summer months in order to guarantee usage. If you are interested in reserving one of the pavilions, an application form is available on the Borough website (www.hallamborough.com), or you may stop by the Borough office and pick one up. A security deposit of \$45.00 is required for all pavilion rentals. The application fee and the security deposit must be paid at the time the application is submitted. There is a calendar on the Borough's website to check availability, but it is best to confirm a date first by contacting the Borough Secretary at 717-755-0810 or via email at secretary@hallamborough.com, prior to submitting any paperwork/fees.

Security Deposit—\$45.00

Borough Resident Fee—\$50.00

Non-Borough Resident Fee—\$125.00

TIME TO WALK THE DOG....DO YOU HAVE EVERYTHING??

Having a safe public sidewalk system in the Borough gives children and adults the opportunity to experience low impact exercise outdoors on a daily basis. At any given time, parents with strollers, elderly walkers, or dog walkers take advantage of nice weather by using our sidewalks. Although a majority of the dog walkers are diligent about picking up after their dogs on these strolls, some are not.

It is violation of the Hallam Borough Code (Chapter 2, Part 2) to fail to clean up dog feces immediately, so taking the dog out means being prepared to do that. Cleaning up dog waste allows everyone to take full advantage of our sidewalk system, prevents storm drain pollution and ensures a healthy outdoor life.



Do I need a permit for.....?

Some common residential construction projects may require on a zoning permit, some only a building permit and some both. In a few instances, no permit is required. Zoning permits are issued by Hallam Borough. Building (construction) permits are issued by Code Administrators, Inc., Hallam Borough's third-party building code official under the Pennsylvania Uniform Construction Code. Applications for both zoning permits and building permits are available to download from the Borough's website (www.hallamborough.com).

On June 3rd 2022 the Kreutz Creek Valley Lions Club will have the anniversary of their founding on June 3rd 1942.

A group of men interested in forming a Lions Club in the Hellam area held a meeting on May 6th 1942.

The following provisions were adopted at that meeting;

- *The organization shall be called the Kreutz Creek Valley Lions Club
- *The club shall consist of a body of men thoroughly representative of the business and professional interests of the Kreutz Creek Valley and vicinity.
- *The club may admit to membership, only residents of Kreutz Creek Valley and vicinity.

Plans were made for a charter meeting to be held on June 3rd 1942. There were a total of 26 men who attended that meeting. The charter was closed on May 21st with 29 members. The Lions Club originally formed of all men, has now changed and is made up of men and women all dedicated to serving the community.

In 1982 the Kreutz Creek Valley Lions sponsored the formation of the Kreutz Creek Valley Ambulance Club. The Lions built the building on Forry Ave beside the Methodist church. Half the building was reserved to house the new Ambulance that would be bought and dedicated on June 31st 1982.

This large club of 85 members at its peak has served the community well over the years. Just a few of the functions and fund raisers that have been provided over the years are listed below;

Chicken BBQ at York Fair, Pork pie supper, Ham and oyster supper, 50-50 raffles, Ham and cheese sandwiches, Collecting aluminum cans, Sub sandwiches, Booth at Hallam Carnival, Bicycle raffle and others not listed.

From the profits raised from these many fund raisers the Lions contribute money to the following organizations;

York Historical society, Hellam Historical society, Eye Glasses and Examinations for local residents, Beacon Lodge for the Blind, Wills Eye Hospital, Leader Dog Training, York County Blind Center, Kreutz Creek Valley Ambulance Club, Hallam Fire Co, Yorkanna Fire Co, YMCA, YWCA, Salvation Army, York County Cancer Society, Drug Abuse Program, Scholarship for Eastern High School, Kreutz Creek Valley Library, Emig Park, Hallam Rec, many more too numerous to list.

Special donations in past year; Donation to maintain the War Memorial in Hallam, Apartment fire victims on Hallam Market St, Truckloads of needed supplies that were shipped to the Kentucky Tornado Victims

The KCV Lions Club at its peak membership had 85 members, it has decreased in members over the past years and now on our celebration of our 80th Anniversary we are searching for new members who are interested in helping our community. You must be interested in working to make money and then giving it away to important causes in our community and to Blind organizations nationwide. This year we are also focusing on helping Diabetes victims locally and nationwide.

LIHWAP

(Low Income Household Water Assistance Program)

This is a temporary emergency program to help low-income families pay overdue water bills. LIHWAP is a grant so therefore you do not have to repay it.

LIHWAP Crisis grants may be available if you have an emergency situation and are in jeopardy of losing your water service. You can receive one Crisis grant for your drinking water service and one Crisis grant for your wastewater service, up to \$2,500 each. There are income guidelines that must be met in order to be eligible.

To receive help....


- You don't have to be on public assistance
- You must have an unpaid water bill
- You can either rent or own your home

Crisis situations include:

- Past-due water bills
- Termination of utility service
- Danger of having utility service terminated (received a notice that service will be shut off within the next 60 days)
